Dear Partners in Learning,

Starting this week, students will have the opportunity to take a second diagnostic i-ready assessment. The Diagnostic starts each student at a level based on an educated guess that includes their chronological grade level. As students answer questions correctly or incorrectly, the test adjusts up or down, with questions of varying difficulty, until the assessment reaches the level of difficulty that is "just right" for each student. This means that on the i-Ready Diagnostic, no two students will take the same test. Just as every student has a different ability level, every student will have a different test experience. Students will see material teachers haven't covered. This is an intentional part of the design of the adaptive assessment. Students may see above-grade level material and below-grade level material. Every student will receive a challenging test. The Diagnostic is designed for students to get about 50% of the questions correct and 50% incorrect to help identify their precise abilities on a range of skills. A student's assessment score is not based on the number of items he or she answers correctly. A student's score is determined by making adjustments after each item to determine his or her proficiency level estimate. Encourage students to try their best and make their best guess if a question seems too difficult. It is better for a student to guess and move on than to try for too long to get a question right. i-ReadyCentral.com/FamilyCenter

Health services is sending out this letter as a reminder to check your child periodically for head lice. Below is helpful information to help you learn more about head lice.

1. What to look for:

- Itching of the scalp that does not go away.
- Small whitish eggs (nits) attached to individual hairs that are difficult or impossible to remove. Be careful not to confuse nits with dandruff or hair gel that can be brushed off of the hair shaft.
- Tiny brownish insects (lice) that are usually found close to the scalp, which are flat in shape, measure 1/10 to 1/8 of an inch in length and have short thick legs. The insects can move quickly but do not jump or fly.

2. How head lice are spread:

- By direct head to head contact with someone who has head lice.
- By sharing personal items such as combs, brushes, hair accessories, hats, scarves, jackets, sweaters, towels, sheets, pillowcases, blankets...
- Several studies have shown that lice are not highly transferable in the school setting.

3. How a case of head lice is treated:

- By using over the counter and prescription rinses and shampoos. There are also many home-based "suffocation" remedies.
- Removal of all nits. This is very important and you should inspect your child's hair every day for a week to ensure that all nits are removed.
- It is necessary to repeat treatment in 7 to 10 days.

4. How to attend to the environment:

- Wash or dry clean all recently worn clothing and bed linens. Remember to include hats scarves, gloves, mittens and hair accessories.
- Whenever possible, place items in a clothes dryer at high heat for 20 minutes.
- Clean combs and brushes by soaking in hot (130 degree) soapy water or lice control product solution for 10 minutes, then scrubbing with an old tooth brush.
- Check all household members/contacts, but only treat them if they have lice. Do not treat as a precaution. Pets are not carriers of lice.
